NWEA MAP Testing



These tests will provide data on students growth from the start of the year (September MAP Test) to the present. This is an important assessment for students, particularly for our 3rd grade students as this score is included in the Third Grade Reading Guarantee. Preschool

- **Religion** Students will be reading different stories about when Jesus was a young boy. We will also continue to learn about Jesus' life through songs with Mrs. Krick.
- Language Arts Students will learn their letters Oo and Pp. We will be practicing these letter sounds and how to write these letters too.
- **Math** Students will practice their numbers 11-20. We will also be practicing sorting objects based on color, shape, and size.
- Science Students will learn about Winter and what animals do during winter time.
- Social Studies Students will learn about New Year's and share their family's traditions.

Kindergarten

- Religion Students will learn about New Year's and resolutions.
- Language Arts Students will begin studying onset and rhyme with simple CVC words.
- Math Students will begin chapter 6, which studies addition for numbers 0-20.
- **Science** Students will identify regions (land and oceans), how technology can help investigate changes, and why paying attention to results is important.
- **Social Studies** Students will study New Year's traditions around the world and create resolutions or goals for the rest of the school year.

Grade 1

- **Religion** We will be learning about the teachings of Jesus after his Baptism and practicing our first grade prayers.
- Language Arts We will be learning the floss rule (-//, -ss, -ff) and the digraph ch-
- Math We will be moving on to Chapter 6 to learn ordinal numbers and position words. We will
 continue on to learn numbers 11-20 so we can begin again learning strategies to add and subtract from
 0-20.
- **Science** Students will identify regions (land and oceans), how technology can help investigate changes, and why paying attention to results is important.
- Social Studies We will be exploring the life and legacy of Martin Luther King Jr.

Grade 2

- Religion We are in the middle of a study on Liturgical objects used during the Mass.
- Language Arts We will spend one more week reading fictional stories to understand the narrator's point of view. Then we will move into a unit of study on informational reading with a focus on Biography.
- **Writing** In writing we will continue our unit on informative writing to share what we know about animals, and historic people.
- **Grammar** We will be learning about subject/verb agreement, pronouns, antonyms, and reviewing quotation marks.
- **Math** We will practice our mental math skills with addition and subtraction using 3 digit numbers. We will also be working on our math fluency with daily flash card and timed test practice.
- **Science** Students will identify regions (land and ocean), wind patterns that develop over various regions, and how technology can help monitor changes.

• **Social Studies** – We will study animal habitats and historic people to help us research topics for our informative writing pieces.

Grade 3

- Religion Students will learn about New Year's and resolutions and the Church calendar.
- **Reading** Students will continue reading *Charlotte's Web*.
- English Students will focus on using capitalization, commas, and quotation marks.
- Writing Students will learn to use details from a story to support their opinions.
- **Math** Students will begin learning about fractions.
- Science Students will investigate how fossils are made, why extinction occurs, and how some kinds
 of living things that once lived are similar to living things today.
- Social Studies Students will continue to learn about the continent of Antarctica.

Grade 4

- Religion Students will learn about the 7th and 8th Commandments
- Language Arts Students will be working on nonfiction text features, fact and opinion, and reading nonfiction books and articles.
- **Math** Students will finish practicing long division and take a test on multiplication and division. Students will learn to read and create different graphs and charts to visually represent data.
- Science Students will learn about physical changes on the Earth's surface.
- **Social Studies** Students will learn about the Civil Rights Movement and what happened after World War II.
- Art Students will weave with yarn.

Grade 5

- Religion Students will learn about the Sacraments of Marriage and Holy Orders.
- Language Arts Students will be working on nonfiction text features, identifying topic sentences, and reading various nonfiction texts.
- Math (Selzer) Students will multiply and divide fractions and take their chapter 4 test.
- Math (Musselman) Students will learn about area and base and height of a triangle.
- **Science** Students complete their study of life science with an investigation of how traits are inherited and the specific structures of earthworms that help them function and survive.
- Social Studies Students will learn about A New America and the Great Depression.
- Art Students will create a container with clay.

Grade 6

- Religion Students will begin chapter 8, "The Israelites Journey to Egypt".
- **English** Students will be diagramming sentences with complex subjects and predicates as well as learning a new set of idioms.
- **Reading** Students will finish the short story, "The Ravine".
- *Math (Selzer)* Students will evaluate expressions and solve equations.
- Math (Wispé) Students will understand percent notation and write equivalent fractions, decimals, and percents.
- Science Students will continue studying the structure and function of organelles in cells.
- Social Studies Students will take a test on ancient China and begin a new chapter on Hebrews and Judaism.
- Art Students will finish their Chinese banners.

Grade 7

- Religion Students will read parables and interpret what Jesus taught us.
- **English** Students will continue a grammar unit on verbs.
- Reading Students will be reading and analyzing memoirs.
- *Math (Wispé)* Students will interpret, solve, and graph direct and inverse proportions.
- *Math (Selzer)* Students will learn about properties of angles.
- **Science** Students will continue a unit on weather and climate
- **Social Studies** Students will be learning about Alexander Hamilton and the economy of the United States.
- Art Students will finish their paintings that are based on art movements.

Grade 8

- Religion Students will study the early Church persecutions.
- **English** Students will write their historical narratives and continue to work with modifiers with their writing.
- Reading Students will be examining story structure.
- Math (Poux) Students will be working with linear equations in Slope-Intercept and Standard form.
- **Math (Selzer)** Students will solve systems of equations by graphing, the elimination method, and substitution. They will take their chapter 5 test.
- **Science** Students will complete a unit on Earth's History and begin a unit on reproduction and heredity.
- **Social Studies** The Gilded Age will be completed.
- Art- Each student will create a quilt piece that tells a story about events in his or her life. This project
 was inspired by two quilts that were on display at the Underground Railroad Museum that we saw on
 our field trip.
